The SMI trust fund would remain in financial balance indefinitely, however, due to the annual redetermination of pro-program financing. Background Roughly 41 million people were eligible for Medicare benefits in 2002. HI, or Part A of Medicare, provides partial protection against the costs of inpatient hospital services, skilled nursing care, post-institutional home health care, and hospice care. SMI ( Part B ) covers most physician services, outpatient hospital care, home health care not covered by HI, and a variety of other medical services such as diagnostic tests, durable medical equipment, and so forth. Only about 22 percent of HI enrollees received some reimbursable covered services during 2002, since hospital stays and related care tend to be infrequent events even for the aged and disabled. In contrast, the vast majority of enrollees incur reimburs-able SMI costs...



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
